



Effective Immediately:

March 6th, 2017

To conform with recommended guidelines with from FEMA, National Weather Service, and SkyWatch; Greenwood County Emergency Management and Greenwood County Sheriff's Department have adopted new policy regarding the activation of outdoor warning sirens.

Siren Activation

- The National Weather Service issues a tornado warning and the affected community is located within the tornado warning polygon.
- Trained storm spotters have reported a tornado. Reports from non-trained weather spotters will require confirmation before activation occurs.
- During a Severe Thunderstorm Warning, ONLY IF: Destructive winds of 80mph or greater are observed by a trained spotter or indicated in the National Weather Service warning statements.
- Other emergency as directed by emergency management or senior law and fire officials.

GREENWOOD COUNTY NO LONGER ACTIVATES THE SIREN FOR FIRE DEPARTMENT ALERT

Siren Testing

Sirens will be tested; weather permitting, March-October on every Monday at 1800hrs. If testing is questionable due to conditions, contact Emergency Management or the Sheriff.

This policy replaces all previous siren activation rules, guidelines, and memos.
