

GREENWOOD COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING
SEPTEMBER 29TH, 2025

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Commission Chair, Mac Obourn, called the regular meeting of the Greenwood County Commissioners to order at 9:00 a.m. Other members present were Roy Ballard, Ron Mast, Judd Everitt, County Clerk Deann McCaffree. Commissioner Preston Evenson was absent. County Counselor Paul Dean joined the meeting at 9:20am.

Commissioners led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Everitt moved to approve September 22, 2025 minutes as written. Mast seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Claims:

Ballard moved to approve Special Payables for September 29th, 2025 in the amount of \$1,527.17. Mast seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Mast moved to approve Regular Payables for October 3rd, 2025 in the amount of \$202,381.83 Ballard seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Ballard moved to approve Payroll for October 3rd, 2025 in the amount of \$154,360.16. Everitt seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

New Business:

- Jamie Lindamood provided a Eureka High School community service update to the commissioners. She also discussed that the fair board has approved a sizeable budget for repairs on the Braden Room as well as other areas at the Eureka Downs.
- Commission Chair Mac Obourn signed the court system budget that had recently been approved.
- Greenwood County Sheriff Heath Samuels spoke to the commissioners regarding the purchase of a new Durango from Parks Motors to replace the totaled wrecked Durango.

Old Business:

- Commission Chair Mac Obourn signed an easement agreement with the Corp. of Engineers allowing for the blacktop part of BB road going into Whitehall Bay to be a graveled.

Obourn motioned for a 10-minute executive session on Hebb fence letter with County Counselor Paul Dean. Ballard seconded. Motion carried 4-0. Returned at 9:36am No decision.

Obourn motioned the Hebb fence was found insufficient and owners of both properties will be responsible to repair their right-hand side of the fence with a dead line of April 15, 2025. Everitt seconded. 4-0.

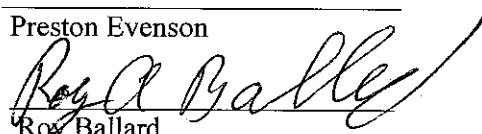
- County Commissioners signed the letter regarding the Hebb fence decision after it was written by County Counselor Paul Dean.

Everitt moved to adjourn. Ballard seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

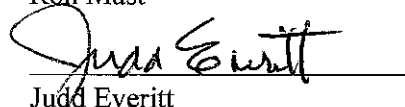
